### Received with good humor the rumors of their pregnancy

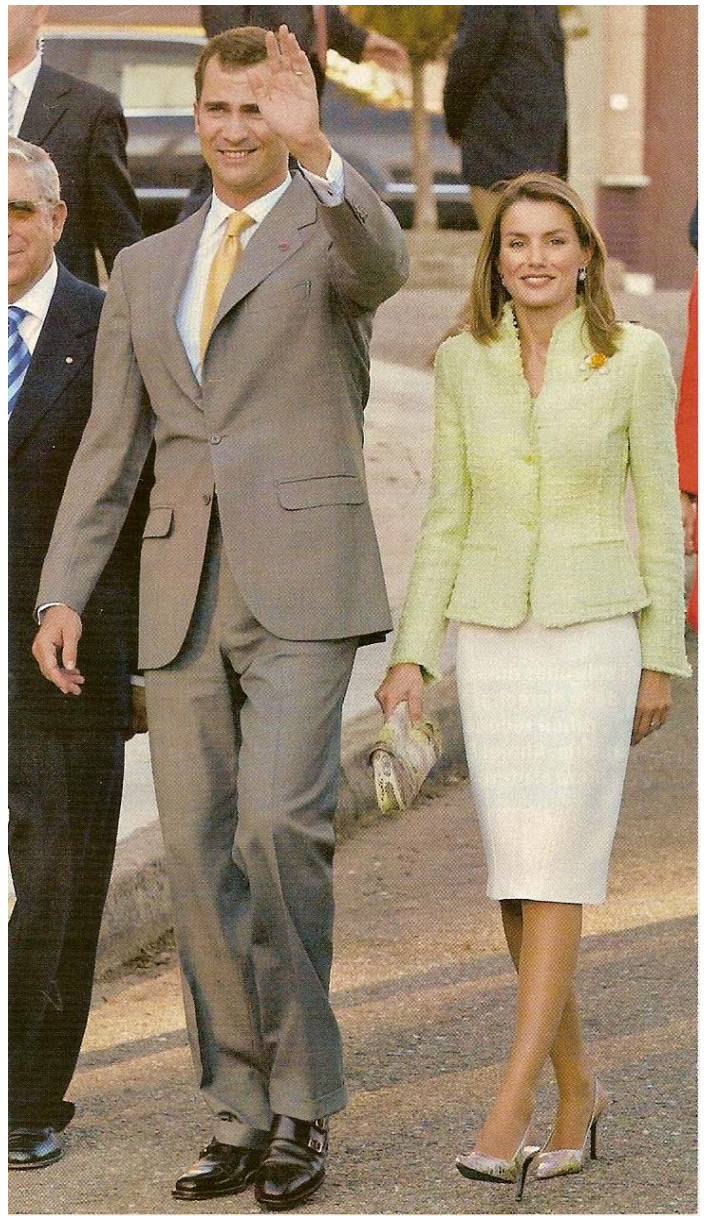
They made their first official trip to Galicia and attended a charity concert

After celebrating privately the 32<sup>nd</sup> birthday of Letizia, who received from her husband a gift of a gold ring with an oval-shaped, black opal *en cabochon*, the couple made their first official trip to Galicia. During their stay in Santiago de Compostela, where they attended the pilgrims' mass with the archbishop officiating in company of hundreds of pilgrims from all over Spain and various countries, the Prince and Princess of Asturias surprised the reporters who were covering their trip by commenting very relaxed and smiling on the rumors of their possible pregnancy.

#### “You will be the first to find out”

In spite of the fact that these rumors have been flying throughout the summer, they had intensified in recent days after the maternal grandfather of Letizia, when questioned by a reporter on whether his granddaughter might be expecting, answered: “*This is a secret that they should tell you.*”

Prince Felipe recommended to the communication media that they not be “*victims of other people's rumors,*” while Princess Letizia assured us that “*the rumors of pregnancy will always be there, but when it is true you will be the first to hear, after the Prince.*”



On their return to Madrid, the couple attended, together with the King and Queen, a concert in favor of the Alzheimer project, over which Queen Sofía presides, which featured performances by artists such as Julio Iglesias, Los Pecos, Alberto Cortez, Miguel Ángel Muñoz, the Dúo Dinámico and Carlos Núñez, among others.
